

CHAMPION OF THE COMMUNITY AWARD



City of Rocklin Jerry Mitchell, Trail Keepers Program

Jerry Mitchell has an impressive background in connection to the City of Rocklin, starting off as a 40-year resident, sitting on the Parks and Recreation Commission for a year and serving a term on the Rocklin City Council from 1987 to 1991.

In 2019, Jerry brought a proposal for the "Trail Keepers" program to City. Through this flexible program, trash collecting supplies, t-shirts, safety gear, and training are provided to all volunteers before their first journey. During daily or weekly walks through Rocklin Parks and Trails, they clean up trash, notify staff of damages and safety issues, and help keep the City well preserved for all to enjoy.

Over the last 20 months that this program has been in place, volunteers have covered almost 400 miles and spent almost 340 hours helping to keep our Rocklin spaces fresh. It is because of Jerry Mitchell's love for his community that we thank him for his selfless dedication to the Rocklin Parks and Trails system.



RECREATION & COMMUNITY PROGRAM AWARD



The City of Sacramento Department of Youth, Parks, & Community Enrichment Youth Division Workforce

YPCE Youth Division Landscape & Learning Program

The City of Sacramento Department of Youth, Parks, & Community Enrichment Youth Division Workforce Development Unit delivers the Landscape & Learning (L&L) program. L&L is a unique youth employment opportunity that has been hiring young people for more than 12 years. This work-based learning experience allows young people 14-17 years of age an opportunity to be employed seasonally and receive specialized training in tool usage, pruning of trees and shrubs, landscaping, and plant/weed identification.

As the Stay-at-Home Order extended beyond March and into April, staff were determined to continue providing this employment opportunity for the young people as this job experience is the first for many. A virtual training curriculum was developed providing a complete and enriching learning experience for all hired staff. The virtual learning topics focused on the development of critical 21st Century skills, sustainable living by planting home gardens, safety in the workplace, financial literacy, cyber security, CDC protective measures and safety protocols to name a few.

Commencing in 2020, the virtual groundbreaking video and progress videos are a more recent example of community outreach. The District was able to film stunning drone shots of the project site through various stages of construction while working with Creatiform Media. In addition to drone footage, all project parties collaborated to create individual groundbreaking shots of every District Board of Director, Park Maintenance & Recreation Improvement District Oversight Committee Member, and every City Council Member involved in the project.

The video is part of a series of videos the District has produced to keep the community updated on the Cordova Pool Replacement Project. Together the videos have garnered over a thousand views on YouTube and the District has received an overwhelmingly positive reaction from the community. In using this method of outreach, the District has created an increasingly diverse outreach plan that will be used for future projects.









City of Folsom Parks & Recreation Broder Family Homestead Park

Broder Family Homestead Park opened to the public in July 2020. The park is located on property that was once part of the expansive Broder Family Ranch, which was established in the mid-1800s. The five-acre property for the park was generously gifted to the City by Vera Broder-Silberstein, who spent part of her childhood on the ranch in the 1930s and '40s. Broder Family Homestead Park preserves the historic and cultural resources of the Broder Ranch Complex. This uniquely passive park is an integral and inspirational part of the City of Folsom's truly distinctive parks, recreation and open space system.

Broder Family Homestead Park was deeded to the City of Folsom and completed on 07/21/2020.

Chad Gunter City of Folsom




